Infrastructure Facilities

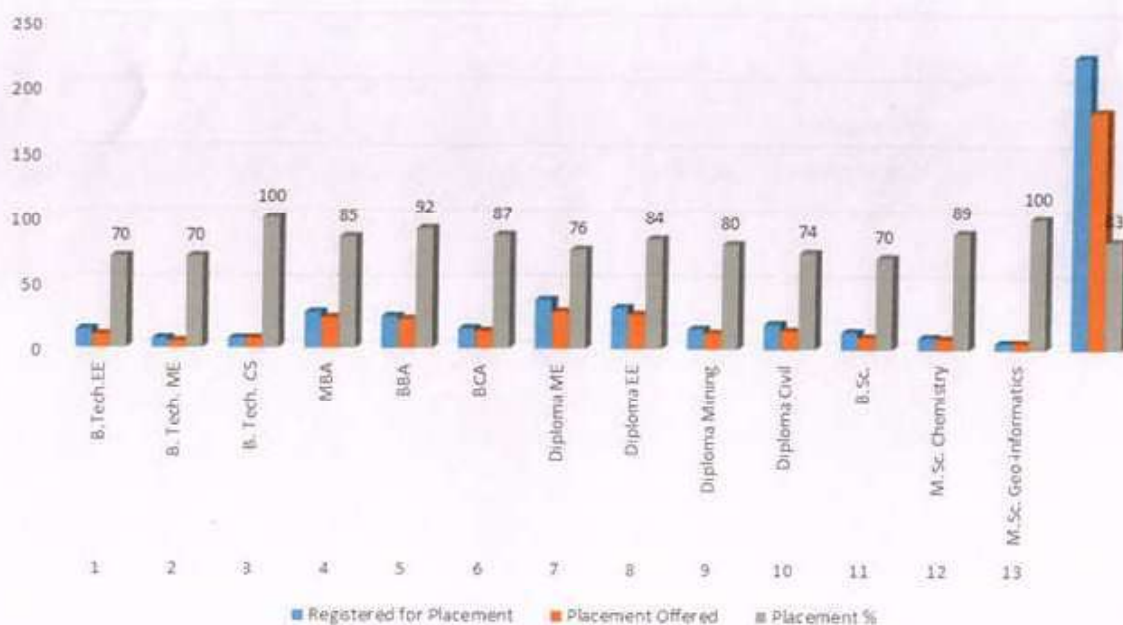



A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. BASIS OF PRESENTATION
