# Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita - A New Criminal Law: A Step Towards Modernization of the Indian Legal System - An Overview & Comparison

The Indian Penal Code was the principal law on criminal offenses in India. This code was formulated based on the recommendations of the first Law Commission established in 1834 under Thomas Babington Macaulay's leadership following the Charter Act of 1833. The IPC was enacted during the British colonial era. It was the main legal document that explained the various criminal offenses and provided punishments for people found guilty of committing offenses. Over the years, the Indian Penal Code has been amended to add new offenses and change the quantum of punishments. The Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita was first introduced in the Lok Sabha on 11th August 2023 to replace the British-era Indian Penal Code completely and received the assent of the President of India on 25th December 2023.

Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita largely retains the provisions of the Indian Penal Code, adds some new offenses, and removes some offenses.

## Key Highlights:

- **Addressing Colonial Legacy:**  
Shedding 160-year-old colonial baggage & Aligning criminal law with Indian values and ethos.
- **Modernizing outdated provisions:** updating archaic language and concepts, reflecting contemporary social realities, and technological advancements.
- **Tackling emerging crimes:** combating terrorism and organized crimes more effectively, addressing new forms of social and economic offenses, with special emphasis given to victim protection, compensation, and rehabilitation.
- The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita aims to simplify, as the Indian Penal Code was criticized for its completeness and inconsistency with 511 sections and 26 chapters, resulting in overlapping and poorly defined offenses causing confusion in its application. The Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita contains 358 sections and 20 chapters.
- The Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita added a new form of punishment under Section 4(f)—"Community Service," which is explained under the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita.
- Promoting gender justice and equality, removing discriminatory provisions, ensuring gender-neutral laws, and addressing specific crimes against women and marginalized groups.

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While the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita presents a commendable effort to modernize India's penal system and expedite the justice process, careful attention is needed to refine certain aspects. The consolidation and simplification of provisions demonstrate an intention to enhance clarity and efficiency, and the proposed heightened penalties for serious offenses are positioned as potential deterrents. However, vigilance is essential, particularly regarding new additions related to offenses against the state and public tranquility, to avoid any unintended ambiguity or misinterpretation. It also has some flaws, as there is no definition provided for community service. Overall, the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita represents a progressive step towards reforming the criminal justice framework, yet it requires meticulous scrutiny for both phraseology and intent, ensuring a balance between contemporary needs and the preservation of fundamental principles.

The proposed changes in the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita signify a modernization effort to address contemporary challenges and enhance the effectiveness of the Indian legal system.





## Event Highlights

### Educational Visit to the Supreme Court and National Commission for Women

Students from the School of Legal Studies embarked on an educational visit to the **Supreme Court** of India and the **National Commission for Women**, aimed at enriching their understanding of judicial processes and women's rights advocacy. At the Supreme Court, students observed live courtroom proceedings, gaining firsthand insights into the functioning of India's highest judicial body. They witnessed legal arguments and learned about landmark judgments that shape the legal framework of the country. Subsequently, at the National Commission for Women, students engaged with officials to understand the commission's pivotal role in safeguarding and promoting women's rights. Discussions centred on initiatives addressing gender-based discrimination, violence against women, and strategies for women's empowerment. Faculty coordinators **Dr. Omprakash D. Somkuwar**, **Dr. Shreejaya Patil**, and **Mr. Gaurav Saxena** emphasised the visit's significance in bridging theoretical knowledge with practical applications, preparing students for future legal careers. A total of **twenty-six students** from the B.A.-LL.B. programme joined this visit.



### Free Legal Aid and Awareness Camp

The Legal Aid Clinic Committee of SOLS organised a Legal Aid Camp held on **7 March 2024** at Mahatma Gandhi Government School in Mangrop, Bhilwara. Expertly coordinated by faculty member **Mr. Shashank Shekhar Singh**, the event emerged as a resounding success. The primary goal of the event was to provide crucial legal assistance and guidance to underserved community members, particularly focusing on girls and their families. Our esteemed guests, Retired Judge **Mr. Shiv Kumar Sharma**, Pro-Vice Chancellor **Prof. Manas Ranjan Panigrahi**, **Mrs. Vandana Kaushik**, Principal of MGS Mangrop, and **Mr. Mahendra Kumar Sharma**, member of the District Legal Services Authority, graced the occasion. Chief Guest Mr. Shiv Kumar Sharma and Honorable Guest Mr. Mahendra Sharma led discussions on women's rights, domestic violence prevention, education rights, child marriage prohibition, legal aid, victim compensation, mediation, and the role of the District Legal Services Authority. 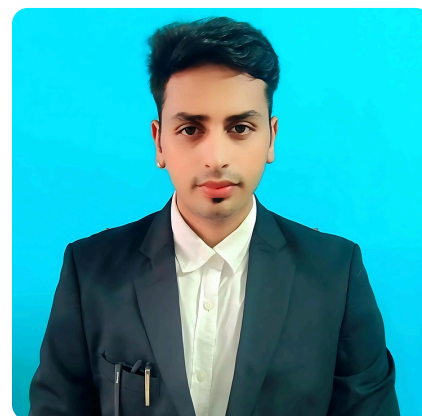
