

Guideline for Authors

Authors are invited to submit their original research work, review articles that are not published elsewhere. Papers advocating a high impact in significantly advancing the knowledge in given field are considered. Authors should prepare their manuscript as per the format. Authors are advised to submit duly signed Copyright Form with the articles.

Please read the following instructions carefully: –

Paper Submission Format:

The article being submitted to the Conference may be submitted as per the Standard format with standard citation method e.g. MLA/IEEE/ APA/Chicago

(Note: The paper should be in Single Line Format)

Font: Times New Roman / Unicode (For Hindi)

Size:12 and 14(for Title)

Space:1.15'

Length of papers:

Published articles are normally less than 10 printed pages. Therefore, at the processing editor's discretion, manuscripts which are longer than 10 pages may be returned to the authors with a request that they be shortened before being considered further (this upward limit includes references, tables, figures and captions– everything except supplemental files and graphical abstracts). On the other hand, extremely short papers less than 3000 words will not be processed.

SI Units:

SI units should be used throughout.

Structure of paper:**Author(s) Information:**

It should have Title of the paper, Name(s) of author(s) and their affiliation where the actual work was done below the names indicating all affiliations with a lower-case superscript letter immediately after the author's name and in front of the appropriate address. It should be clearly mentioned that who will handle correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication, also post-publication.

Abstract:

Paper should start by a short abstract (Max. 300 words). The abstract should indicate the content of the paper, and should describe the main conclusions so that the particular usefulness of the full text may be decided. In abstract, references should be avoided and if essential they must be cited in full.

Keywords:

It should have a maximum of 5 keywords which appropriately represent the contents of the paper.

Introduction:

It should describe the background of the problem in brief, the scope of up gradation, objective and novelty of the research work.

Theory/calculation:

This section should contain the information about the methods adopted to carry out the research work i.e. sample preparation and their characterization, procedures followed, software used if any and the researcher's, new findings. It should also have the practical development or the required mathematical formulation of the methodology from a theoretical basis.

Results & Discussions:

Result section should have researcher's new findings with logical justification for the results obtained. Results should be compared with the existing published work, if possible.

Conclusions:

At the end of the article, some conclusive remarks on the present study should be mentioned.

Acknowledgement:

Author should acknowledge the support of those individuals who provided help during the research at the end of the article before the references, if any. It may include the information about any research grant or support received from any funding agency or the assistance of colleagues.

Ethics in publishing:

1. Secrecy:

Information regarding submitted manuscripts should be highly confidential, Editorial staff must not be allowed to discuss about manuscripts other than the corresponding authors, reviewers, potential reviewers, other editorial advisers and the publishers as appropriate.

2. Unbiased deal:

Manuscripts are evaluated at any time by an editor without considering race, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, ethnic origin citizenship or political philosophy of the authors.

3. Originality of work:

The authors should submit their original work and if the authors have used the work and/or words of others then it should be suitably cited or quoted.

4. Quality work:

Authors are required to present a report of original research work with accurate account of the work and objective discussion of its significance. The data presented

in paper should contain sufficient detail and references to permit others to replicate the work. Any kind of knowingly inaccurate statements will be considered as unethical behavior and are unacceptable.

5. Multiple Publications:

Authors should not publish their research findings in more than one journal.

6. Changes to authorship:

It is advised to author to be ensured about the completion of author list before submitting the final version of manuscript to the processing editor. Once the paper has been processed or accepted, author's name will not be allowed to add, delete or rearrange.

7. Acknowledgment: Acknowledgement of the work of others must be mentioned by author. Authors should cite publications that have been significant in determining the nature of the reported work.
