New Era New Approach: Towards Education System

Is Something Wrong with Our Education System?

The answer, for most of us, comes instinctively, 'Yes', something definitely is. But the more important question is not whether something is wrong, rather what exactly are we learning?

Our education system, as it largely stands today, prioritises marks over meaning, obedience over inquiry, and memorisation over realisation. Students are trained to score well but are rarely encouraged to think deeply. We are taught what to think, not how to think. For a majority of students, education becomes a relentless race for grades. Yet, in this pursuit, crucial questions remain unanswered.

- Where are the skills that prepare us for life?
- Where are curiosity, creativity, expression, innovation, and self-worth?

Interestingly, those who truly succeed despite this rigid system often do so not because of it, but in spite of it. They move forward powered by curiosity, self-expression, and the courage to ask questions—qualities that are rarely nurtured within conventional classrooms.

The renowned poet Nida Fazli captures this truth beautifully:

“धूप में निकलो घटाओं में नहा कर देखो,
ज़िंदगी क्या है किताबों को हटा कर देखो।”

Books are essential, undoubtedly. But life cannot be understood through books alone. Education must go beyond syllabus and examinations. It must prepare individuals for real experiences, ethical dilemmas, leadership, and self-awareness.

A Glimpse into Our Past

India's ancient education system offers a compelling contrast. The Gurukul system was holistic, inclusive, and rooted in values. A king's child and a commoner's child sat side by side, learning under the same Guru, following the same discipline, and earning knowledge through effort rather than privilege. There were no shortcuts, only wisdom, character, and responsibility.

However, this philosophy changed drastically during the colonial era. The British education system was designed not to create thinkers or leaders, but clerks, followers, and compliant workers. Unfortunately, many remnants of that model continue to influence our system even today.

Into the Digital Era

In the digital era, the concerns surrounding our education system have become even more pronounced. While technology has undeniably expanded access to information, it has also reduced learning, in many cases, to passive consumption. Classrooms have shifted to screens, notes to PDFs, and discussions to muted microphones, often prioritising speed and convenience over depth and understanding.

Students today can access vast knowledge with a single click, yet critical thinking, reflection, and original thought

are frequently overshadowed by copy-paste culture, algorithm-driven content, and exam-oriented online coaching. Social media and digital platforms reward quick answers and surface-level engagement, leaving little room for contemplation, dialogue, or failure—elements essential for genuine learning.

However, this digital age also carries immense potential. If used consciously, technology can democratise education, foster interdisciplinary learning, encourage innovation, and give students a voice beyond classroom walls. The real challenge, therefore, is not technology itself, but how we choose to integrate it—whether as a tool for curiosity and empowerment or merely as a faster extension of an already flawed, marks-centric system. For education to remain meaningful in the digital era, it must combine technological advancement with human values, inquiry, and wisdom, ensuring that progress does not come at the cost of purpose.

Artificial Intelligence and Education

The rise of Artificial Intelligence marks a decisive moment in the evolution of education, amplifying both its possibilities and its shortcomings. AI-powered tools can personalise learning, bridge language barriers, provide instant feedback, and make quality education accessible beyond geographical and economic limits.

However, when integrated uncritically into an already exam-driven system, AI risks further reducing education to efficiency and output rather than understanding and ethics. Students may begin to rely on machines for answers instead of developing reasoning, originality, and moral judgment. The danger lies not in AI replacing teachers, but in students forgetting how to think independently.

At the same time, AI challenges us to redefine the purpose of education itself. If machines can memorise, calculate, and even generate content better than humans, then human learning must focus on what machines cannot replicate—empathy, creativity, ethical reasoning, leadership, and social responsibility. Education must therefore shift from information delivery to wisdom cultivation, preparing students not merely to use AI, but to question, guide, and govern it responsibly. Only then can AI strengthen education rather than hollowing it out.

The Way Forward

The purpose of education should be to empower, not merely to employ. It should cultivate questioning minds, ethical individuals, and responsible citizens. Reform may seem daunting, but meaningful change always begins with awareness.

The first step is to think critically. The next is to take small, conscious actions—encouraging dialogue, valuing skills, nurturing creativity, and redefining success beyond marks.

Because when collective thought meets collective action, even the most deeply rooted systems can transform. Education should not just help us clear exams. It should help us understand life.

यात्रा वृत्तांत – राजधानी की यात्रा

हर यात्रा हमें बहुत कुछ सिखाती है। ऐसी ही एक यात्रा मेरी भी थी—राजस्थान की राजधानी जयपुर की।

मेरी यह यात्रा भीलवाड़ा रेलवे स्टेशन से शुरू होती है और इसी के साथ प्रारंभ होता है स्वयं को समझने और सीखने का सफ़र। यही पहली सीख मुझे मिली कि हर यात्रा कुछ न कुछ सिखाती है और यात्री को अपने सामान का स्वयं ध्यान रखना चाहिए और अपने प्रति ज़िम्मेदार होना चाहिए।

भीलवाड़ा से जयपुर की इस यात्रा के दौरान मैंने यह महसूस किया कि यह केवल एक यात्रा नहीं, बल्कि जीवन का रूपक है। मैंने देखा कि प्रकृति किस प्रकार निरंतर अपना स्वरूप बदलती रहती है।

यह कहना भी गलत नहीं होगा कि यात्रा की शुरुआत तो रेलगाड़ी (परिवहन साधन) में बैठने से काफी पहले ही हो जाती है। जब मन में अनेक विचार आते हैं कि जीवन निरंतर आगे बढ़ता रहता है, जैसे बहता हुआ जल सदैव शुद्ध रहता है। धूप, सर्दी और मौसम का क्रम निरंतर चलता रहता है यहीं से यात्रा की वास्तविक शुरुआत होती है। इस बीच कई प्रश्न और अनेक सपने जन्म लेते हैं कि अपने गंतव्य पर पहुँचकर क्या किया जाएगा।

यात्रा को आगे बढ़ाते हुए मैं जयपुर रेलवे स्टेशन पहुँचा। लाउडस्पीकर की घोषणाओं के माध्यम से यह सुनाई दिया कि रेलगाड़ी जयपुर पहुँच चुकी है। अपने सामान और विचारों के साथ मैं प्लेटफ़ॉर्म पर उतर आया। अब प्रश्न यह था कि मुझे अपने मित्र के चारदीवारी के कमरे तक पहुँचना था यदि उसके कमरे की बात करूँ तो उसने देखी थी एसएससी परीक्षा संबंधी कई किताबें और कई जागी हुई रातें।

खैर अब मुझे मेट्रो के जरिए मेरे दोस्त के कमरे तक पहुँचना था चूँकि यह मेरी जयपुर की पहली यात्रा थी, इसलिए यह अनुभव मेरे लिए नया था। फिर भी मैंने यह पड़ाव पार कर लिया जैसे हम बचपन में अपने माता-पिता की उँगली पकड़कर चलते हैं ठीक वैसे ही किसी अनजान व्यक्ति की सहायता से।

अंततः मैं अपने मित्र के कमरे तक पहुँच गया। उसी दिन हमने यात्रा की रूपरेखा बनाई और तय किया कि पहला पड़ाव होगा गोविंद देव जी मंदिर।

यात्रा को गति देते हुए मैं जयपुर के कई स्थानों पर गया। यह पाँच दिवसीय यात्रा थी, जिसमें मैंने अनेक धार्मिक स्थल—गलता जी, बिरला मंदिर, गोविंद देव जी मंदिर—और कई ऐतिहासिक स्थल—जंतर-मंतर, हवा महल, सिटी पैलेस (राजमहल), अल्बर्ट हॉल संग्रहालय, तथा मेट्रो संग्रहालय देखे।

इन सभी में मुझे विशेष रूप से जल महल और आमेर का किला अत्यंत आकर्षक लगे। यद्यपि हर यात्रा समय-सीमा में बँधी होती है, और पलक झपकते ही ये पाँच दिन समाप्त हो गए।

अंत में मैंने अपने मित्र से विदा ली और फिर मिलने का वादा किया। यदि अपने अनुभव के बारे में कहूँ, तो हर यात्रा हमें कुछ न कुछ बदल देती है।

अंत में यही कहूँगा—

“कुछ यात्राएँ हमें बदलती हैं,

और जीवन जीने का एक नया नज़रिया देती हैं।”

4 One-Day Workshop on Protection of Rights Against Domestic Violence

The School of Legal Studies organized a one-day workshop on '*Protection of Rights Against Domestic Violence*' on 26 September 2025, under the joint aegis of *Bal evam Mahila Chetna Samiti and Direct Action for Women*. The workshop aimed to sensitize students on issues of gender justice, women's rights, and the multifaceted nature of violence faced by women in society.

The programme was enriched by the presence of eminent speakers, including *Tara Ahluwalia, President of Bal evam Mahila Chetna Samiti; Dr. Renuka Pamecha, Retired Professor, Kanoria College; and Mamta Jetli, a social activist*. The speakers shared valuable insights on women's rights, child marriage, women's participation in property ownership, gender discrimination, and the various forms of violence experienced by women.

The programme was actively supported by *Parmesh Mali, Programme Coordinator, Bhavna Joshi, Block Coordinator, Shyamlal, Block Coordinator and Vishal*, whose contributions played a significant role in the successful conduct of the event.

During the sessions, the speakers engaged in in-depth discussions on sensitive issues concerning women's rights. They highlighted the constitutional framework, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), female foeticide, and child marriage. The deliberations further emphasized the role of family, society, religion, caste, law, the executive, and the judiciary in shaping the status of women in India. Special focus was placed on women's rights in ancestral property, the neglect of homemakers' property rights, and the urgent need to address gender-based discrimination and violence.

As part of the workshop, a *poster-making and presentation activity* was organized for students. Participants creatively depicted various forms of violence against women, including physical and domestic violence, violence in the parental home, verbal and mental abuse, sexual violence, discrimination based on caste, community, or religion, workplace sexual harassment, and economic violence. Through powerful visual representations and presentations, students effectively conveyed the need for social change and gender equality.

The workshop concluded on an inspiring note with all participants collectively singing "*Dariya ki Kasam, Maujon ki Kasam, Yeh Tana-Bana Badlega*", creating an atmosphere of energy, optimism, and a renewed commitment towards women's empowerment.

'Apne Department Ki Diwali' Celebration

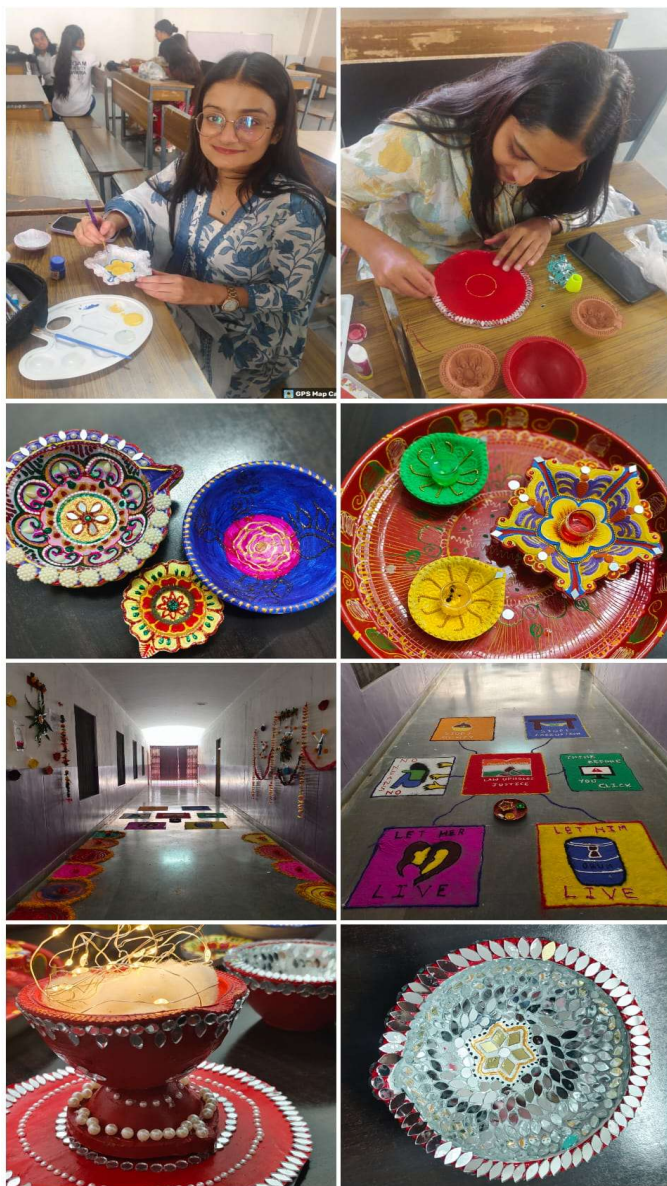

Educational Visit to District Jail, Bhilwara

The School of Legal Studies successfully organized an educational visit to the *District Jail, Bhilwara* on 21 November 2025, with the objective of providing students with practical exposure to prison administration and the functioning of the criminal justice system.

During the visit, *Shailendra Singh Fauzdar, Superintendent*, along with *Heera Lal, Jailor of the District Jail, Bhilwara* briefed the students in detail about the jail premises, security arrangements, rehabilitation programmes for inmates, and special facilities available for women prisoners. The interaction enabled students to gain first-hand knowledge of custodial management and correctional practices.

Addressing the students, the Jail Superintendent elaborated on practical aspects such as the food system, parole procedures, and prisoner meeting processes. He also provided valuable insights into the concept of the *Open Jail*, explaining its objectives, functioning, and role in the reformation and reintegration of prisoners into society.

Following the visit, students were instructed to prepare *analytical reports* based on their observations relating to food arrangements, sanitation, prison administration, recreational facilities, and accommodation systems within the jail. This exercise aimed to enhance their analytical skills and practical understanding of penology and correctional administration.

Overall, this educational initiative by Sangam University proved to be an enriching and insightful experience for the students, significantly strengthening their understanding of the practical dimensions of criminal law and prison administration.



National One-Day Seminar Organised on Constitution Day

On Constitution Day, a one-day national seminar titled 'युवाओं के परिप्रेक्ष्य में विकसित भारत-2047 का संविधान: चुनौतियाँ और संभावनाएँ' was organised on 26 November 2025. The seminar was jointly organised by the Faculty of Arts & Humanities and the Faculty of Law.



The programme commenced with a soulful rendition of Vande Mataram by students of the Department of Music, commemorating the 150th anniversary of the national song. *Prof. Rajeev Mehta, Dean, Faculty of Arts & Humanities*, delivered the welcome address.

Delivering the keynote address, *District Judge, Bhilwara, Abhay Jain* urged the youth to act as vigilant guardians of the Constitution and actively contribute towards realising the vision of a developed India by 2047. He emphasised the principle of 'Liberty with Responsibility' as the cornerstone of constitutional citizenship.

The special guest, *Additional District Judge, Bhilwara, Vishal Bhargava*, highlighted the role of youth as a vital bridge between society and the judiciary. He stressed that local civic issues should be addressed through Public Interest Litigations to strengthen the concept of a welfare state as envisioned in the Constitution.

Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bhilwara, Nagendra Singh elaborated on the evolutionary nature of the Indian Constitution, stating that its strength lies in its adaptability to changing times and circumstances. He described the Constitution as the guiding framework for all laws enforced in the country.

Vice-Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Karunesh Saxena, appreciated the modernisation of the judicial system and suggested exploring the use of robotics and artificial intelligence in judicial processes. He underlined the need to ensure access to justice for the poor and the speedy disposal of pending cases.

The technical session, chaired by *Vikram Singh, Assistant professor, School of Engineering* and *Mukesh Sharma, Associate Professor, School of Management studies*, witnessed the presentation of 34 research papers. In the paper presentation competition, *Abhinav Jain (B.A. LL.B. XI semester)* secured first position, *Prince Prajapat (B.A. LL.B. III semester)* stood second, and *Gunjan Joshi (B.A. V semester)* won third prize.

During the valedictory session, *Pro Vice-Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Manas Ranjan Panigrahi*, described 'Live and Let Live' as the soul of the Constitution and emphasised that adherence to constitutional values is the fundamental duty of every citizen. This was followed by the recitation of the Preamble of the Constitution by *Deputy Dean, Jorawar Singh Ranawat, School of Arts and Humanities*. The session also witnessed the felicitation of winners of the Hindi Day competitions, along with the showcasing of an art gallery exhibition organised by the Department of Fine Arts.

The session was highly interactive and informative, enabling students to develop a systematic approach to legal research. The workshop significantly contributed to strengthening students' understanding of technology-driven legal resources and their application in legal education and practice.



11 Two-Day Workshop on Design and Development of Micro-Course Content



The School of Legal Studies successfully organised a two-day workshop on 'Design and Development of Micro-Courses' on 17 and 18 December 2025. The workshop was led by *Prof. (Dr.) Manas Ranjan Panigrahi, Pro Vice-Chancellor, Sangam University.*

Faculty members from the departments of Law, Management, Arts, Science, Pharmacy, Commerce, Agriculture, and Engineering actively participated in the programme. The workshop aimed to initiate the development of micro-courses at the departmental level and to familiarise faculty members with structured approaches to designing short, outcome-oriented courses.

The sessions focused on practical activities covering the entire development cycle of micro-courses, from defining learning objectives to content creation, delivery, and evaluation. Emphasis was laid on key principles such as focusing on a single learning objective, adopting a learner-centric approach, and utilising diverse and engaging media formats.

Prof. (Dr.) Manas Ranjan Panigrahi explained that micro-courses can be made effective through a systematic approach involving clearly structured content, progressive learning modules, and appropriate digital tools. He highlighted that careful planning, quality content development, and evaluation mechanisms are essential to ensure the academic effectiveness of micro-courses.

During the workshop, faculty members actively shared their views and suggestions on various modules, contributing to the refinement and improvement of proposed micro-courses. Eight departments presented sample course content and outlines for conducting micro-courses at the departmental level in 2026, reflecting interdisciplinary collaboration and innovation.

The programme was conducted under the guidance of *Prof. (Dr.) Karunesh Saxena, Vice-Chancellor, Sangam University.* The vote of thanks was delivered by *Dr. Om Prakash Somkuwar, Dean In-charge, School of Legal Studies.* *Dr. Manoj Kumawat, Director, CSD Department,* was also present during the workshop.

In total, 24 faculty members from various departments participated in the programme, making it a significant step towards institutional capacity building and innovation in teaching and learning practices at Sangam University.

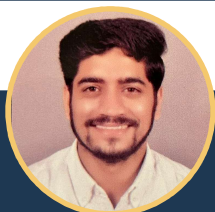
